NOTICES OF MOTIONS

I. Minister of Finance:

That this Assembly –

In line with Section 65(8) of the Customs and Excise Act;

Agrees to the Amendment of Government Gazette No. 6574, Part 2A of Schedule No. 1: Customs and Excise Act, 1998.

II. Minister of Environment and Tourism:

That this Assembly –

Agrees to the Ratification of the Southern African Development Community (SADC) Protocol on Environmental Management for Sustainable Development.

III. Mr. Mbai:

That this Assembly –

Discusses the issue of urbanization and its impact on our towns and cities.

There are various aspects that need to be carefully interrogated when dealing with this issue of our people migrating to towns and cities in search of better future. Indeed there are key questions that need to be answered, investigated and digested when dealing with these questions.

IV. Mr. Van Wyk:

That this Assembly –

Discusses and Debates possible measures to address the roaming of domestic animals along national and districts roads, causing accidents and the loss of human life.

V. Mr. Murorua:

That this Assembly –

Discusses the conditions under which a liquid that is brewed and sold for human consumption in our shanty townships by steaming or distilling old dirty clothes like underwear, boots, shoes and whatever dirty materials that bare available and which is confusing and poisoning our people on the grass-roots level;

- and the consumable hygiene of the materials that is used in this process; and
- that this matter be referred to a relevant Parliamentary Standing Committee for further investigation and reporting.

VI. Mr. Venaani:

That this Assembly –

- (i) *Discusses* value addition on all our extractive industries, more so the mining sector as means to stimulate unemployment and high foreign earnings.

African countries have exported basic raw materials, missing out on opportunities to turn basic ingredients into finished goods that can earn them more income.

Value addition is not economically exploited in Africa, making it difficult for the continent to grow. Namibia needs to invest in industrialization to create jobs as well as increase the foreign exchange.

Africa and indeed Namibia relies majorly on exporting its raw materials only to buy them back in the form of finished products.

- (ii) *Debates* the need to put a curb of 30% of products to be put through value addition.
- (iii) That this Motion be referred to the Parliamentary Standing Committee for further input.

VII. Mr. Kavekatora:

That this Assembly –

Discusses and debates the relevancy of the continuous use of EVMs in our presidential, national, regional and local authority elections.

That this Motion, after debate in the House, be referred to the relevant Parliamentary Standing Committee for further investigation.
