Despite the fact that equal treatment is one of the fundamental principles of our democracy, it seems that our Constitution is directly and indirectly discriminating against certain members of society. In particular, the Namibian Constitution impedes the rights of Members of the National Council, Region and Local Authority Councilors as well as civil servants from freely participating as candidates in the National Assembly elections.

That this House debates Article 47 (1) (e) (f) and (2) (b) of the Namibian Constitution in as far as it violates the rights of the above-mentioned members of the Namibian society from freely participating in the National Assembly elections.

That this Motion be referred to the relevant Parliamentary Standing Committee for further scrutiny and report back.

Further Debate on the Motion of Ms. Dienda put aside by the Speaker for his Ruling.

# 6. THIRD NOTICE OF A MOTION:

*Discusses* the separation of powers as an essential element of democratic systems and serves as a guarantee of the proper functioning of governments and parliaments as unique institutions with specific functions within democracies.

Given the importance of separation of powers in ensuring accountability and good governance, that this House interrogate and discuss the current status of separation of powers in Namibia as it relates to the proper and efficient functioning of Parliament.
