RETABLING OF THE RATIFICATION OF THE AGREEMENT ON THE **ESTABLISHMENT** WALVIS BAY- NDOLA - LUBUMBASHI OF THE DEVELOPMENT CORRIDOR: MOTIVATION STATEMENT BY JOHN MUTORWA, MP AND MINISTER OF WORKS AND TRANSPORT (MWT): NATIONAL ASSEMBLY, WINDHOEK, 23 FEBRUARY 2021.

1.1. BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:

- (a) On the 5th of March 2010, in that beautiful touristic city of Livingstone, in the Republic of Zambia, the three respective Ministers of Transport, for: the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), the Republic of Zambia and the Republic of Namibia; adopted and signed the Agreement on the Establishment of the Walvis Bay - Ndola- Lubumbashi Development Corridor.
- (b) This NINETEEN (19) pages document, containing FIFTY EIGHT (58) Articles was tabled, in this honourable and respectable House, on Thursday, 18 February 2021; and copies were also distributed to the Honourable Members of the National Assembly, on that same day, 18 February 2021.

- (c) The Cabinet of the Republic of the Republic of Namibia, at its 7th Meeting, held on 6 July 2010, by its <u>DECISION NUMBER</u>: 7th /06.07.10/009, approved the said Agreement and authorized the Minister of Transport, to table the Agreement in the National Assembly for ratification, in accordance with the provisions of <u>ARTICLE 63 (2) (e)</u>, of the Namibian Constitution: "to agree to the ratification of or accession to international agreements, which have been negotiated and signed in terms of Article 32 (3) (e), hereof"
- (d) <u>Minutes</u> of the <u>Proceedings of the National Assembly</u>; dated <u>6 July 2011</u>, <u>7</u> <u>July 2011</u> and <u>12 July 2011</u>, respectively, bear clear and irrefutable evidence and testimony, that: the subject matter, that I am <u>re-motivating</u>, today, featured on the National Assembly's <u>ORDER PAPER</u> or <u>AGENDA</u>, on the mentioned dates.
- (e) It appears, though, that: for certainly specific legitimate and valid reasons and compelling prevailing practical circumstances, <u>then</u>, the item was never discussed; nor procedurally disposed off, since then! That situation, Honourable Speaker, is deeply regretted; I am sure by both the Executive, through the MWT's Minister, and Legislative Organs of the Namibian State. The saying: "<u>Better late, than Never</u>;" Honourable Speaker, Honourable Members of the National Assembly, I believe, is more applicable and acceptable here! So also, the expression: "<u>to err, is human</u>; but to give is divine!"

1.2. CONTENT OF THE AGREEMENT

- (a) The Agreement, under discussion, contains <u>FIFTY EIGHT (58) Articles;</u> commencing with <u>ARTICLE 1</u>, dealing with <u>definitions</u> of terms; and ending with <u>ARTICLE 58</u>, entitled: <u>DURATION</u> and <u>DENUNCIATION</u>.
- 1.3. Furthermore, I wish to specifically draw the attention of the Honourable Members, to the following Articles:

- (a) Article 2: Scope;
- (b) Article 2: Objectives;
- (c) Article 4: Obligations of the Contracting Parties;
- (d) Article 7: Composition and Functions of the Organs
- (e) Article 7 (d) (i)-(vii): Permanent Secretariat.
- (f) Article 27: Transport by Rail.
- 1.4. Honourable Speaker, Honourable Members of the National Assembly; having said all the aforementioned, many many words, it now remains my pleasant public duty; which I am executing on behalf of the Executive Organ of the Namibian State, that: this National Assembly, <u>debates</u> and <u>discuss</u> the content of the said tabled Agreement, <u>approves</u> it unanimously (without any voting) and <u>ratify</u> it, accordingly, again, in accordance with the provisions of Article 63 (2) (e) of the Supreme Law of Namibia.
- 1.5. Thank you very much, Honourable Speaker, and I accordingly so move; in accordance with the explicit provisions of <u>ARTICLE 40 (i)</u> of the Namibian Constitution: "the Members of the Cabinet shall have the following functions: to assist the President, in determining what international agreements are to be concluded, acceded to or succeeded to and to report to the National Assembly, thereon."
