**I. Minister of Information and Communication Technology:**

That leave be given to provide for the appointment of an independent and impartial Information Commissioner and Deputy Information Commissioners; to provide for the obligations of public entities; to provide for the right of access to information held by public and private entities; to provide for the promotion, creation, keeping, organisation and management of information in a form and manner that facilitates transparency, accountability, good governance and access to information; to provide for requests for access to information; to provide for internal review, appeal and judicial review of decisions on access to information; to provide for information exempt from disclosure; and to provide for incidental matters.

**II. Minister of Health and Social Services:**

That this Assembly –

*Discusses and agrees* to the Ratification of the Treaty for the Establishment of the African Medicines Agency.

**III. Dr. Iijambo:**

That this Assembly –

*Debates and discusses* the National Reconciliation Policy. Chapter III of the Supreme law of the country, the Constitution of Namibia is clear on ‘Protection of Fundamental Human Rights and Freedoms’.

Thirty years after independence, the hollow, if not absent National Reconciliation Policy leave pockets of Namibian people in jeopardy. Yet Article 8 of the Constitution emphasizes Respect of Human Dignity.
