I. Minister of Land Reform:

That this Assembly

In terms of Section 4 of the Agriculture (Commercial) Land Reform Act, No.6 of 1995:

Appoints the following persons as members of the Land Reform Advisory Commission:

- (ii) Mr. John Hamukoto Akwenye new appointment

- (iv) Mr. Jeff Ugwanga Mbako re-appointment

II. Mr. Kavekotora:

That this Assembly –

Discusses and *debates* ways and means on how to make Government payment system conducive to business and Small and Medium Enterprises (SME) promotion.

That this Motion be referred to a relevant Parliamentary Standing Committee for further investigation.

III. Mr. Nekundi:

That this Assembly –

- (i) *Discusses* whether the current high traffic fines imposed on the traffic offenders are reasonable and just for our society.
- (ii) *Discusses* the impact of these high traffic fines on the pockets of drivers and vehicle owners, especially the low income earners.
- (iii) Further *discusses* the possibility for the traffic fines to be reduced and aligned with the reality of the majority of our people.

After debate, that this Motion be referred to the relevant Parliamentary Standing Committee.

IV. Mr. Muharukua:

That this Assembly -

- (i) *Discusses* the scourge of serious and fatal motor vehicle accidents that our public roads have become notorious for.
- (ii) Further *debates* the possibility of establishing a Central Bureau of Road Surveillance; and the possibility of subjecting all public passenger transport vehicles, and all heavy goods vehicles to a mandatory satellite tracking system, as a measure to curb motor vehicle accidents.

That this Motion be referred to the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Economics, Natural Resources and Public Administration for investigation.
