# WEDNESDAY, 28 APRIL 2021

The Assembly met pursuant to the adjournment.

- 1. The Speaker took the Chair and read the Prayer and Affirmation.
- 2. The Speaker laid upon the Table, in terms of Rule 96(a) of the Standing Rules and Orders –

The re-submission of a petition against the legalization of marijuana in Namibia, lodged on 15 April 2021 by an organization called Turning Point Namibia.

The Speaker referred the Petition to the relevant Parliamentary Standing Committee for consideration, investigation and report back to this Assembly.
