**NOTICES OF MOTIONS**

**I. Prime Minister:**

That this Assembly –

I accordance with Article 112(3) of the Namibian Constitution –

*Approves* the nomination by His Excellency the President of Mr. Gerson Hizembi Kamatuka and Mr. Salmaan Dhameer Jacobs, and the re-appointment of Ms. Batseba Katjioungua as members of the Public Service Commission for the period of five years.

**II. Mr. Tjeundo:**

That this Assembly –

*Discusses* the plight of the people of Kombat. The people of Kombat have over the years sought audience and urgent intervention from Government on the issue surrounding the ownership of Kombat.

**III. Dr. Muinjangué:**

That this Assembly –

*Discusses* representation and participation of women in politics in Namibia; whether women are equally represented as their menfolk and if not, for this House to come up and adopt a solution to it.

**IV. Ms. Moongo:**

That this Assembly –

*Discusses* the need for the creation of a Sex Offenders Register.

There has of late been a number of violent rape incidents perpetuated against women and children across the country. In most cases, these incidents take place within the homes and institutions deemed to be safe. It is thus imperative that we create a comprehensive Sex Offenders Register to identify potential would-be offenders and protect our women.

V. **Mr. Kauandenge:**

That this House –

*Discusses* the conditions of Local Authorities in Namibia.

It is a given fact that Local Authorities are the backbone of our country when it comes to service delivery. This is the entry point where our people can tap on all basic services, hence there is need to discuss the following –

Current conditions of our Local Authorities and why many of them fail to execute their mandates. And whether sufficient resources are available by Central Government to empower them.

VI. **Ms. Dienda:**

Despite the fact that equal treatment is one of the fundamental principles of our democracy, it seems that our Constitution is directly and indirectly discriminating against certain members of society. In particular, the Namibian Constitution impedes the rights of Members of the National Council, Region and Local Authority Councilors as well as civil servants from freely participating as candidates in the National Assembly elections.

That this House debates Article (1) (e) (f) and (2) (b) of the Namibian Constitution in as far as it violates the rights of the above-mentioned members of the Namibian society from freely participating in the National Assembly elections.

That this Motion be referred to the relevant Parliamentary Standing Committee for further scrutiny and report back.

VII. **Mr. Muharukua:**

That the National Assembly visits the Kunene region to familiarize itself with the persistent drought conditions that have caused the loss of livestock and livelihoods in the Kunene region.

That he shall further move that this visit occurs on an urgent basis prior to the tabling of the National Budget.

Finally, that the Speaker/National Assembly deals with the Motion in the appropriate manner to ensure that the said visit occurs.
