SECTION I: INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1. Rights of Public Entity

The National Council reserves the right:

- (a) to split the contract as per the lowest evaluated cost per item, or
- (b) to accept or reject any quotation; and
- (c) to cancel the quotation process and reject all quotations at any time prior to contract award.

2. Preparation of Quotations

You are requested to quote for the items mentioned in Section III by completing, signing and returning:

- (a) The Quotation Letter in Section II with its annex for Bid Securing Declaration
- (b) the List of Goods and Price Schedule Section III;
- (c) the Specifications and Compliance Sheet in Section V; and
- (d) any other attachment deemed appropriate.

You are advised to carefully read the complete Request for Sealed Quotations document, including the Special Conditions of Contract in Section VII, before preparing your quotation. The standard forms in this document may be retyped for completion but the Bidder is responsible for their accurate reproduction.

3. Validity of Quotations

The Quotation validity period shall be 30 days from the date of submission deadline.

4. Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible to participate in this Quotation exercise, you should:

- (a) have a valid certified company Registration certificate specifying shareholders
- (b) have an original valid good Standing Tax Certificate;
- (c) have an original valid good standing Social Security Certificate;
- (d) have a valid certified Affirmative Action Compliance Certificate, proof from Employment Equity Commissioner that bidder is not a relevant employer, or exemption issued in terms of Section 42 of the Affirmative Action Act, 1998;
- (e) have a written undertaking as contemplated in section 138(2) of the Labour Act, 2007
- (f) have a valid certified certificate indicating SME Status (for Bids reserved for SMEs);
- (g) Submit certified identity copies of the shareholders **NOT for Company Directors**
- (h) submit a signed Bid Securing Declaration;
- (i) Submit a valid confirmation letter from the bank

5. Bid Securing Declaration

Bidders are required to submit a Bid Declaration for this procurement process. The Bidder shall furnish as part of its quotation.

6. Delivery

Delivery shall be 90 working days after acceptance/issue of Purchase Order. Deviation in delivery period shall not be accepted /shall only be considered if such deviation is reasonable. The following tests and inspections will be conducted on the goods at delivery:

Before delivery of the final product, you are required to submit sample of the minutes for approval.

7. Sealing and Marking of Quotations

Quotations should be sealed in a single envelope, clearly marked with the Procurement Reference Number, addressed to the National Council with the Bidder's name and contact information at the back of the envelope.

8. Submission of Quotations

Quotations should be deposited in the Quotation Bid Box located at National Council, Ground Floor not later than **Wednesday, 12 October 2022, 10h00 AM** . Quotations by post or hand delivered should reach Parliament- National Council, Private Bag 13371, Windhoek by the same date and time. **Late quotations will be rejected.**

9. Opening of Quotations

Quotations will be opened internally by the National Council immediately after the closing time referred to in instruction 8 above. A record of the Quotation Opening stating the name of the bidders, the amount quoted, the presence or absence of a Bid Security/Bid Securing Declaration, will be posted on the website of the Public Entity and available to any bidder on request within three working days of the Opening.

10. Evaluation of Quotations

The National Council shall have the right to request for clarifications in writing during evaluation. Offers that are substantially responsive shall be compared on the basis of price or ownership cost, subject to Margin of Preference where applicable, to determine the lowest evaluated quotation.

11. Technical Compliance

Bidders shall submit along with their quotations documents, catalogues and any other literature to substantiate compliance with the required specifications and to qualify deviations if any with respect to Public Entity's requirements.

The Specifications, Performance Requirements and Compliance Sheet details the minimum specifications of the goods/items to be supplied. The specifications have to be met but no credit will be given for exceeding the specifications.

12. Prices and Currency of Payment

Prices shall be fixed in Namibia Dollars.

13. Margin of Preference

The Purchaser will, however, be entitled to any decrease in the prices of the Goods and Services subject to adjustment.
- (b) If the currency in which the Contract Price P_0 is expressed is different from the currency of origin of the labor and material indices, a correction factor will be applied to avoid incorrect adjustments of the Contract Price. The correction factor shall correspond to the ratio of exchange rates between the two currencies on the base date and the date for adjustment as defined above.
- (c) No price adjustment shall be payable on the portion of the Contract Price paid to the Supplier as advance payment.
