NOTICES OF MOTIONS

I. Mr. Muharukua:

That this House -

Debate affirmative action measures specifically targeted at, and tailored to alleviating the socioeconomic challenges faced by the previously disadvantaged members of our Defence Force and our Police Service while they are in service and after they retire.

Further, that this Motion be referred to the relevant Parliamentary Standing Committee for further scrutiny.

II. Minister of Finance:

That leave be given to amend the Stamp Duties Act, 1993, so as to insert certain definitions; to introduce a stamp duty of N\$100 per existing mortgage bond that is transferred to a special purpose entity; and to provide for incidental matters.

III. Minister of Finance:

That leave be given to amend the Income Tax Act, 1981, so as to insert additional circumstances under which amounts are deemed to have accrued from a source within Namibia; to clarify the deduction of contributions made to company-owned policies; to increase tax deductibility of retirement fund and education policy contributions; to provide for the furnishing or serving of a tax return or notice of assessment in electronic format; to amend the rules relating to the allocation of tax payments; to provide for thin capitalisation rules; and to provide for incidental matters.

IV. Minister of Finance:

That leave be given to amend the Value-Added Tax Act, 2000, so as to substitute the words "prescribe" or "prescribed"; to provide for a definition for assessment; to enable a person carrying on a taxable activity but is not yet making taxable supplies to be registered; to provide that the conducting of a taxable activity or the importation of goods by a registered person must be connected with the making of taxable supplies; to enable the Commissioner to determine the manner in which a tax return or notice of assessment may be furnished or served; to provide for the allocation of VAT payments; to zero rate the supply of sanitary pads; and to provide for incidental matters.
