NOTICES OF MOTIONS

I. Mr. Muharukua:

Places in Omusati and parts of Oshana Region such as Omahenene, Omakuwa, omangololwani, Epalela, Omindamba, Iishanaputa, Okathakoushongo, Olupaka, Omuulukila, Outapi, Onambelela, Ombafi, Okeeke, Ogongo and Oshitutuma, Oshipanda, Oshikuku, Onampila, Emo, are some of the villages that have access to the water flowing through the Omahenene Canal.

That this House therefore –

Debate the provision of 40% subsidies towards communal crop farmers residing in these villages and all other villages along the water canal; and

That this Motion be referred to the relevant Parliamentary Standing Committee for further investigation.

II. Mr. Karondo:

In compliance with Section 15 and 116 of the Electoral Act No. 5 of 2014;

That this Assembly –

Consider and approve the Performance Assessment and Post-Election Report for the Ncamagoro Constituency by-election, which was held on 17th December 2021.

III. Ms. Moongo:

That this House –

Discuss and look into the deplorable and inhospitable state of our mental health institutions and facilities, whether the conditions provide for an appropriate and therapeutic environment

Further, that this Motion be referred to the relevant Parliamentary Standing Committee for further scrutiny.

IV. Mr. Amutse:

That as from next year 2023, our budget time in this House should start from February and end in March.

The implementation of the budget must from now on start in April each year to avoid delays in service delivery and project implementation. In addition, the Ministry of Finance should before finalising the budget, consult with all Parliamentary Standing Committees for input, so that when the final budget is tabled, we would have made our inputs and hence will limit lengthy interventions when dealing with the budget from the floor.
