## I. Mr. McHenry Venaani:

Water flowing from bordering areas of southern Angola caused flooding in the northern Ohangwena Region from mid-January 2023. AS of 17 January 2023, local media reported dozens of homes were flooded in nine villages, namely: Engela and Ouhongo, Onanghulo, Omatunda, Omandobe, Oshandubala, Onamilunga, Oikalahanya, Omhedi and Oshitambi.

Village roads are full and blocked by water and people cannot cross these streams as the water is deep. Over 800 learners remain grounded at home, barely a week after school started for the new academic year.

I therefore move that this House *discuss* and *debate* the need to put flood control and management measures that are sufficient, and provide financial aid to the affected communities.

## II. Mr. Swartbooi:

That this Assembly –

*Discuss* and *debate* the current deep crisis in our education sector, with a view to find immediate and long-term interventions to overcome the post-COVID 19 impact with the education system.

#### I. Mr. Smit:

That this Assembly -

*Discusses* that this House carries out a comprehensive inquiry into all aspects of the procedures dictating the tender awarding processes of the Central Procurement Board of Namibia.

There is growing public concern regarding the operations and decisions of the Central Procurement Board of Namibia, which was established by the Public Procurement Act 15 of 2015. Distrust, perceptions of procedural unfairness, corruption, insider trading and manipulation, are regular themes of public discourse as it relates to the tender awarding process. It is against this background that an inquiry is of urgency.

Further, that this motion be referred to the relevant standing committee.

#### II. Mr. Smit:

That this Assembly -

*Discusses* that this House carries out an investigation and full audit of the expenditure of the N\$14.1 Billion budget allocated to the Ministry of Education, Arts and Culture for education – with a comprehensive view into infrastructure and textbook expenditure.

That this audit is tasked to a team comprised of the Auditor General along with 2-3 retired judges, who will submit their report to the Public Accounts Committee of Parliament, who will report to this House.

Further, that this motion be referred to the relevant standing committee.
