The basic rational for the Amendment Bills, namely the Marriage Amendment Bill (B-2023) and the Definition of Spouse Bill (B-2023) follows the recent judgement of the Supreme Court which basically ruled that two men or two women can go out of Namibia get married and will then be legally recognized whilst such marriages in our beloved Republic are not allowed.
