MAIDEN SPEECH OF HONOURABLE KATRINA BENZ, MP, (PDM)

The conditions of the roads in Rehoboth are not in a good state as they need to be upgraded. People continue to suffer because they do not have access to housing and land. The majority of the youth are unemployed and there are no opportunities for the youth in Rehoboth which is also a national crisis. To make matters worse, there is no Institution of Higher Learning in Rehoboth.

The level of Drug Abuse in Rehoboth is beyond our comprehension. This is made worse by the situation at the Police Station in Rehoboth which is at a critical stage. Little to no progress is made during investigations and the police officers seem to be working hand in hand with the drug lords in the town. I therefore urgently call on the Namibian Police to give special attention to the Drug Abuse situation in Rehoboth and capacitate the police officers at the Rehoboth Police Station.

In conclusion, I call on the government to ensure that service delivery at all public institutions is improved. I also call on all Namibians to hold the government accountable and engage themselves in National discourse.
