Honourable Chairperson of the Whole House Committee; Honourable Members;

It gives me great pleasure and honour to present to his August House the budget allocation of Vote 1: Office of the President. The functions and operations of the Office of the President is derived from its Mandate that enjoins functionaries to render effective advisory and administrative support services to the President in the execution of his Constitutional mandate, in terms of Article 27 (1) (2) "The President shall be the Head of State and of the Government and the Commander-in-Chief of the Defence Forces AND The executive power of the Republic of Namibia shall vest in the President and the Cabinet."

Honourable Chairperson of the Whole House Committee; Honourable Members;

With the presentation of this Vote 1, I pay tribute to HE Dr Hage G Geingob, the Late 3rd President of our Republic and the host of the Office of the President. The allocation of funds to this Vote enabled the President to in terms of Article 32 "...perform with dignity and leadership all acts necessary, expedient, reasonable and incidental to the discharge of the executive functions of the Government..."

His Excellency the Late President in the execution of his duties traversed the globe, the length and breadth of this land, to negotiate deals and sign agreements among others, despite his failing health; for the betterment of the living conditions of the people of Namibia, both young and old. May his soul continue to Rest in Peace.

Honourable Chairperson of the Whole House Committee; Honourable Members;

1. During the period under review the Presidency facilitated with the assistance of the Performance Management Unit and in liaison with implementing Offices, Ministries and Agencies the assurance of compliance and provision of quarterly progress reports on the implementation of HPP2.

- 2. It also facilitated stakeholder engagements to ensure that State of the Nation (SONA) directives are on-boarded by implementing institutions,
- 3. The Presidency coordinated high level meetings to facilitate the President's active participation in setting the country's developmental agenda,
- 4. During the period under review the signing of the Agreement between Government and Hyphen Hydrogen Energy was witnessed as an entrant into the pioneering industry to develop Sub-Sahara Africa's largest Green Hydrogen Project, under the championship of the late President. During the Period the Government also signed Join Declarations of Intent and Agreements with key markets such as the European Union, Germany and Japan.
- 5. Several international missions where undertaken to enhance Namibia's role in the attainment of regional, continental and global, aspirations. As a result of this, excellent partnerships were forged, paving the way for the implementation of various projects including the formulation of a Green Industialisation Strategy, which includes Green Hydrogen and its derivatives already mentioned Green Hydrogen Project as well as the development and commercialization of the recently discovered Hydrocarbon potential in Namibia for the benefit of all Namibian citizens, to name but a few key achievements.

Allow me now to focus myself on accounting for the 2023/2024 Financial Year budget allocation for the Office of the President, Vote 1.

VOTE 1: OFFICE OF THE PRESIDENT

The budget Estimate for the 2023/2024 Financial Year was N\$ 970 871 000-00 (Nine Hundred and Seventy Million, Eight Hundred and Seventy-One Thousand Namibian Dollars). The Office has effectively expended a substantial portion of the allocated funds in

line with the revised budget, achieving an overall execution rate of 97.3%.

These funds were predominantly allocated towards essential activities such as utilities, infrastructure maintenance, office equipment replacement, the renovation of the official Presidential residence, and the construction of the Chief Hosea Kutako Museum and Homestead Shrine. The implementation of these activities and programs was instrumental in ensuring the efficient functioning of the institution and the provision of the much needed services to the people of Namibia.

During the year under review the Office oversaw the

According to projections from the International Monetary Fund (IMF), global growth is anticipated to maintain its stability throughout 2024 before experiencing an upturn in 2025. Concurrently, the Namibian economy persists in confronting the challenges posed by independent intervening variables such as the adverse effects of climate change. These challenges manifest in the form of erratic rainfall patterns and the looming threat of drought, which adversely affect both human livelihoods and the survival of animals

Honourable Chairperson of the Whole House Committee; Honourable Members;

I now present to you the 2024/2025 Financial Year budget allocation of N\$ 966 821 000-00 (Nine Hundred and Sixty-Six Million, Eight Hundred and Twenty-One Thousand Namibian Dollars).

This budget comprises N\$ 858 721 000-00 (Eight Hundred and Fifty-Eight Million, Seven Hundred and Twenty-One Thousand Namibian Dollars) allocated for Operational expenditure, representing 89% of the total budget, and N\$ 108 100 000-00

(One-Hundred and Eight Million, One Hundred Thousand Namibian Dollars) allocated for Development expenditure, representing 11% of the total budget.

This budget represents a decrease of N\$ 4 050 000-00 (Four million and fifty thousand Namibian Dollars) translating in 0.4 % in comparison with N\$ 970,871 000-00 (Nine hundred and seventy million, eight hundred and seventy-one thousand Namibian Dollars) allocated during the 2023/2024 Financial Year.

Looking ahead to the fiscal year 2024/2025, we are presented with new opportunities and challenges, including a renewed looming drought despite the gains made in the Green Hydrogen as well as the Oil and Gas space. Also have we seen a presidential transition within a transitional period. All of this put a strain on the budget allocation and renders the Office to stretch its finances and work innovatively to cover every single aspect of the Vote within reasonable financial terms.

The 2024/2025 budget is necessary to enable the President, His Excellency Dr. Nangolo Mbumba to continue the legacy overseeing the conclusion of the implementation of the programs under the Second Harambee Prosperity Plan in key sectors of the Administration.

Thus, this Vote serves as an important instrument in ensuring that the country's economic recovery and job creation initiatives are well coordinated.

The Office of the President comprises Seven (7) main divisions, each with its unique objectives and activities. I wish to highlight the activities planned for each main division with the budgetary allocation.

(a) Main Division 01 - Office of the President

Objective:

To uphold, protect, and defend the Constitution as the Supreme Law of Namibia as well as to discharge the executive functions of Government subject to the overriding terms of the Constitution and the Laws of Namibia, which the President is constitutionally obligated to protect.

Activities:

- Supporting the development of Green Hydrogen,
- Hosting of Bi-National and other ceremonial Events, and
- Monitoring of the conclusion of the implementation of HPPII

The breakdown of the budget allocation is as follows:

(b) Main Division 02 - Administration

Objectives:

- To provide advisory and administrative support services and carry out executive assignments
- To ensure that State Security detects and identifies threats or potential threats to the security of Namibia thereby contributing to the maintenance of peace, security and stability in the country.

Activities:

- Replacement of Air Conditioning System
- Preventative maintenance of office infrastructure
- Utilities

- National Youth Employment Tax Incentives and National Internship programme
- Promotion of Apprenticeships of Namibian unemployed youth in Germany
