REPUBLIC OF NAMIBIA MINUTES OF PROCEEDINGS OF THE

NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

TUESDAY, 2 JULY 2024

The Assembly met pursuant to the adjournment.

- 1. The Deputy Speaker took the Chair and read the Prayer and Affirmation.
- 2. Announcement by the Deputy Speaker in terms of Rule 20(b) of the Standing Rules and Orders:

The Deputy Speaker announced that the Nutrition and Food Security Alliance of Namibia (NAFSAN) engaged some Members of the National Assembly on food security and nutrition in Namibia, during November 2023. Based on the positive response from Members of the National Assembly during that session, NAFSAN once more is hosting an engagement session for MPs aimed at deepening their understanding of nutrition issues, which is crucial given the rising food insecurity and malnutrition rates in Namibia.

The session will take place tomorrow Wednesday, 3 July, 2024, from 11H00 to 13H00 in the Parliament Library and it is being organized in collaboration with the Enhancing Participatory Democracy in Namibia (EPDN) Programme.

Agreed to.

Marriage Bill [B. 5 – 2024] read a First Time.

The Minister of Home Affairs, Immigration, Safety and Security moved, subject to Rule 32(a) of the Standing Rules and Orders, seconded by the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Works and Transport: That the Bill be read a Second Time.

On the motion of Hon. Dienda, seconded by Hon. Katjimune, debate adjourned until Wednesday, 3 July 2024.

7. **FOURTH NOTICE OF A MOTION:**

The Minister of Industrialisation and Trade moved, seconded by Hon. Kavetuna:

That this Assembly –

Agree to the Ratification of the Kampala Protocol on Voluntary Registration of Copyright and Related Rights within the Framework of the African Regional Intellectual Property Organization (ARIPO).

Question put: That the Assembly agree to the Ratification.

Unanimously agreed to.
