I don't doubt the capacity of Government schools against the private school set up, and if one argues on the number of public schools by the year 2022 was at 1947 from 1723 during the year of 2013, a very fair achievement not to add to the additional schools constructed during 2023 to address the classroom shortfall and I am referring to top good quality schools and I believe there are still more schools to come, and for your information the current school intake stands at more or less 96%

And for your information honorable members our public schools are accommodating around 830,000 learners if not more as I haven't come across any complain of children without classroom not ignoring the fact that we are a growing nation, the last census got the statistics.

Honorable speaker if you have 600 learners per school than each school at least benefits a 180,000 Namibian dollars per learner from the NS300 annually which is possibly not enough but adequate to take care of basic needs like stationery from the state to the learner. The claim on hostel tenant meals being provided by the parents is false as we are all aware of the award of tenders through procurement to cater for this aspect.

On the issue of poor performance during covid should not be generalize and perceived as an all along phenomenon as we all know the trauma and difficulties this nation went through, not to ignore the improvement on performance that all of us witness during the last results, there is really a positive pick up.

The pass mark or rate of most of the so-called private schools are questionable as they let not well-prepared learners to the next grade to satisfy the high spending parents. I can challenge you my honorable dear brother that we can run a test of one on one by having a private school learner against a public-school learner on basics and you will be proven wrong.

Fundraising activities has been championed by the very private schools that you are praise singing it was this very entities who brought this fashion not to mention raffle tickets, so I don't see any wrong doing if a public school management can also practice the same to meet Government hallway trough this type of positive initiatives.

Honorable speaker I would than like to request this august house not to entertain this type of wastage of precious time, by further entertain this topic and remove it from the order paper and let the ministry of education under the able leadership of the minister and her deputy carry out future ministerial plans in order to shape the future of our country. Let Honorable Hamata arrange with the Ministry an appointment over a cup of coffee for more clarity as he seems to be ill informed on the subject matter.
