I will speak strongly on the need for job creation and skills development for the youth and also call for the establishment of economic opportunities that focus on the sectors that matter most to the future of our country - agriculture, technology, tourism, and renewable energy. Honorable Speaker, housing is a basic human right, and yet too many Namibians – particularly in rural areas – are living without adequate shelter, water, sanitation and electricity. Access to basic amenities is essential for the dignity and well-being of all our citizens. This is especially true for those living in our rural areas, where the gap between urban and rural living conditions continues to widen.



I will strongly emphasize the provision of affordable housing and infrastructure as a key pillar of our national development agenda. As well advocate for the construction of thousands of affordable houses, focusing on social housing and rural electrification. But beyond the building of homes, we must ensure that these homes are equipped with basic amenities — access to clean water, sanitation, and electricity.

I pledge to work with fellow parliamentarians to accelerate the pace of housing construction. This will require a multi-faceted approach — strengthening public—private partnerships, increasing government investment in housing infrastructure, and making financing more accessible for ordinary Namibians. But most importantly, we must ensure that the rural areas are not left out or behind. We need to strengthen the national program that targets rural electrification, road construction, and clean water initiatives so that



every Namibian, regardless of their geographic location, has access to basic necessities of life.

Improving Education for All:

Honorable Speaker, there is no greater investment a country can make than in the education of its children. Education is the key that unlocks the door to prosperity. Yet, despite significant improvements in access to education, the results have not been what the nation expects. Namibia continues to face challenges in improving literacy, numeracy, and overall educational outcomes.

I will continuously place education at the heart of national development and emphasize the need to improve the quality of education at all levels, from early childhood development to tertiary education. I equally commit to the reform and modernizing the



education system, improving teaching standards, and ensuring that our education system is not only about producing students who can pass examinations, but students who are equipped with critical thinking skills, creativity, and technical competencies needed in the modern world. These will equally prepare them to contribute to the national development agenda in various spheres.



As a parliamentarian, I will advocate for policies that prioritize education reform and ensure that resources are directed to the areas where they are most needed professional teacher continuous such development, the provision of teaching and learning improvement and materials, the infrastructure. But I also believe we need do more to foster partnerships between the education sector and the private sector. This can create opportunities for apprenticeships, hands-on internships, and

Honorable Speaker, the rural economy is the backbone of Namibia. It is in rural areas where we find some of the most hardworking, resourceful, and entrepreneurial people in our country. Yet, too often

than not, rural Namibia is left out of the economic conversation. Agriculture, which is the primary source of livelihood for so many Namibians, faces multiple challenges – drought, land degradation, and a lack of access to markets.

I recognize the critical role of the rural economy and call for a comprehensive strategy to support agriculture and rural development. This includes modernizing agricultural practices, supporting smallholder farmers, promoting Agri-processing and ensuring that rural communities have access to markets and financing.

Honorable Speaker, I will work to ensure that rural Namibia is not just a recipient of aid, but an active participant in national development. By supporting rural infrastructure such as roads, irrigation systems, and agro-processing centers, we can create sustainable

quality education, and rural communities are not left behind in the development process.

Let us work together to turn our aspirations as a nation into tangible outcomes. Let us create a Namibia where the voices of all people – especially the most marginalized – are heard and respected, and as well empowered to be productive members of our communities.
